#### DNP INC. ORGANIZATIONAL UPDATE

Here is an update on the 2021 DNP National Conference that is scheduled to take place August 11-13, 2021 in Chicago. The hotel venue has been extremely flexible and diligent to assure that rooms and all services will be safely provided including adequate social distancing. The AV team is in place to assure each room has a great presentation that will be audio recorded. Many of the sessions will be video recorded and posted to the web site for an after-the-event enduring conference opportunity. Specific sessions or the entire event will be available for purchase within 2-3 weeks after the close of the conference, so we can anticipate more visitors and registrant to the conference starting in September.

Unfortunately, we could not live-stream this event due to the cost of the bandwidth needed to assure a truly synchronous virtual event. We must move toward a recorded version and grow these services in that direction.

We have sent out several surveys and overwhelmingly the response has been that if people show up for a face-to-face conference, the presenters need to be in person (not streamed in or as a recording). This makes sense so all presenters must be present in real-time-and-place in order to be a part of this conference.

We will begin to email presenter invitations on Monday May 3, 2021 and will request a quick turn-around confirmation to attend and present. As we finish up the review process, we can see that many abstract submissions were received before the pandemic hit so some folks may not be comfortable presenting information that was developed about a year ago. We are hopeful that those with the highest scores from the abstract reviewers will accept the invitations and we can have a robust event as a result.

The **OLD** DNP Online Community is being dismantled and will shut down the end of May. The NEW Online community is growing slowly as it replaces a system that has been in existence for about 12 years. The necessity to bring all services under one roof (so to speak) is what is driving this migration and change. Your help in making this happen is appreciated.

#### **INCLUSION OF OTHER DISCIPLINES IN DNP PROJECTS**

A colleague contacted me about the inclusion of other disciplines in DNP projects and shared insights that others may find interesting. Starting a conversation is always a good way to grow our discipline. Please see the message below. Thank you, Dr. Patricia McAfee, for sharing your thoughts.

#### **Inclusion of Other Disciplines in DNP Projects**

The American Association of Colleges of Nursing reports the DNP project must address a complex practice, process, or system that may be harmful to patients or populations. The DNP Project Team should ensure projects are focused on improvement of health or practice outcomes or health policy, reflect culmination of practice inquiry, engagement of partnerships, implement and translate evidence into practice, and evaluate health care, practice, or policy outcomes. Engagement of partnerships is an indication of collaboration for development and execution of an initiative. It is not meant to promote inclusion of disciplines other than nursing in a nursing practice project.

The nursing practice doctorate was formally approved in 2004 by AACN with the primary reason to develop nursing practice knowledge and to gain credibility for nurses practicing at an advanced level of their field. The Task Force on the Practice Doctorate in Nursing defines practice as any form of nursing intervention that influences healthcare outcomes. While the scientific underpinning of doctoral-level practice is not confined to nursing science and theory and we promote interdisciplinary approaches to patient care, the profession of nursing, as a recognized discipline, is organized around nursing knowledge and the art of nursing practice. Nursing science is a unique body of knowledge with theories and evidence tested and translated by nurses.

The Institute of Medicine reports nurses are expected to practice as partners in interprofessional teams to improve quality, cost-effectiveness, efficiency, and outcomes for healthcare. In healthcare, interprofessional collaboration is the process, whereby, different professional groups work together using their expertise to positively impact processes and delivery of services and care. Nursing partnership in interprofessional teams is demonstrated through collaboration with all health care disciplines. However, that partnership is not meant to promote inclusion of disciplines other than nursing in a nursing practice project.

When disciplines other than nursing are included in DNP projects, there is the potential to create erosion of the uniqueness of nursing practice knowledge and skills. DNP projects should focus on that uniqueness of nursing science and sustain the high standards associated with nursing's contribution to health care outcomes. Results from DNP projects should provide evidence for other disciplines and practice partners that can be used within their own specialties; however, the DNP project itself should focus on nursing practice, alone, and be a demonstration of solidarity in protecting the credibility of the most advanced nursing degree that those before us fought to establish. If we allow the continued inclusion of other disciplines in doctorate nursing practice projects, why not just change to a Doctorate in Health Care Professions?
